7. The Dodgers captured their sixth World Series title in October with a 5-2 victory over the Oakland A's in the fifth game of the series.
8. Hurricane Gilbert rose out of the Caribbean like a giant wind storm in late September.
9. The stars of the 1988 Summer Olympics, clockwise from the top: diver Greg Louganis, track and field star Carl Lewis, track star Florence Griffith Joyner and swimmer Matt Biondi. Together these athletes brought home 12 gold medals, 3 silver and 1 bronze.
10. President Ronald Reagan and Soviet Leader Mikhail S. Gorbachev worked for several years to bring the two countries together. After a treaty was signed to eliminate certain nuclear weapons, 1988 was the year the efforts of these two leaders went into effect. 7. The Democrats went to Atlanta in the summer of 1988, and decided on Michael Dukakis to be its candidate for President on the United States. He decided to pick Lloyd Bentsen as his running mate.
